## THE MAIN EVENT

The main race event day on 15 July will feature 12 races including two women's races as well as two international races themed "Umtelebhelo We Afrika".

The day also features choreographed live fashion shows, showcasing upcoming and established designers products.

Hospitality/corporate marquees will be featured under the theme "AFRICAN ROYALTY".

The SMME village will provide trading spaces for local vendors as part of efforts to ensure that small businesses from the area also benefit from economic opportunities.



Commenting on the race, the MEC for Sport, Arts, and Culture, Dr Ntuthuko Mahlaba said several stakeholders reap the economic benefits of the event.

"Model national events have also been established such as the Dundee July which benefits both horse owners and jockeys in the form of stake money and other equine benefits such as access to veterinary services, horse feed, transportation and hospitality sector. Other related sectors also benefit immensely from the hosting of the Dundee July, fashion, arts, transport, retail and hospitality benefit substantially the economic spin-off are critical for our support for this event," said MEC Mahlaba.

This can only be achieved through the solid partnerships we have built over the years and which we continue to harness as we gallop forward."
